Dear Sir/Madam,

Re: **Malicious Communication From Gloucestershire County Council**

I write to you regarding your vexatious and threatening letter of 24th October 2017, sent to me via email by A [REDACTED] H [REDACTED] from Ms D [REDACTED] P [REDACTED] (attached).

Although we do not own a website named whilstincare.info, I can, however, review our site, which has a similar name and will consider any changes. Therefore please provide the following without delay:

Precise details of any page or post on our website where you can evidence personal information of your staff may have been unintentionally published, and which is not publically available elsewhere.

Exact details of page or post where you can evidence details are not factually accurate or truthful, regarding your employee Ms G [REDACTED] or Gloucestershire County Council.

The incident number regarding your contact with The Police.

The contact details of the officer regarding your contact with The Police.

All evidence of my contact with your social worker, Ms G [REDACTED], notably where you alleged my behaviour has been inappropriate.

Ms D [REDACTED] P [REDACTED]'s Health and Care Professions Council registration details.

The Gloucestershire County Council Subject Access Request procedure.

Further, I appreciate that you have a duty to protect your staff and there are likely false claims made against genuinely supportive and professional social workers. However, the social worker provided to my vulnerable brother had an obligation to him and his best interests and a duty to respect of rights, their carelessness has caused considerable distress.

As I informed your social worker, I would seek redress and have since registered my formal complaint with The Office of The Chief Social Worker, who is writing to Herefordshire Council on my behalf, and I will be considering filing a complaint with The Health and Care Professions Council in due course.

Further, as I informed both Gloucestershire Police and Herefordshire Police, I am more than willing to be interviewed by an officer or detective of either force that I have had contact with and prepared to provide my evidence of my claim. I was also advised by the representative of Gloucestershire Police to ask you for the incident number for your report.

I welcome a none threatening, vitriolic or oppressive reply.
